

Genealogy Resources

To assist you in your genealogy queries, it is helpful for us to have key pieces of family information. Since in many cases, families used the same first names over many generations, please provide some of the following information to make any query possible:

Father's name

Mother's maiden name

Dates of birth, death or marriage

The Historical Society can assist you with your Genealogy Requests in one of these ways:

1. If you are going to be in the Nobleboro area between April and October, email us with your query so that we can make an appointment to meet with you to review our files.
2. If you are going to be in the area in July or August, the Historical Center is open Saturdays from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. and by appointment.
3. If you are not in the area, or if your query reaches us after October, we may perhaps be able to do research by mail. You may send the information you have via email, via mail or by phone. If we have information and if there is someone available to do the research, we will be in touch.
4. One final suggestion is to visit the Lincoln County Courthouse in Wiscasset as well as local libraries and other Historical Societies.

We're eager to help with your genealogical and scholarly research questions, even if you cannot visit us in person.

If your question requires just a few minutes to answer, and the reply can be an e-mailed or a few photocopied pages, there is no charge for this service (although donations are always welcome!). More time consuming projects will be handled for \$15 per hour, one hour minimum.

Please include your mailing address! For many queries, the quickest, and therefore least expensive way to respond is with a few photocopied pages.
