His contribution to preserve and share the history of Nobleboro and the whole mid-coast area will be remembered and appreciated – as will his delightful sense of humor, hard work, and his 'focus' to have things done his way. We miss him and often think of him. With his strong interest in helping students, George asked that remembrances go to the scholarship funds at the Historical Society, Town of Nobleboro or Cove's Edge.

Once again, George Dow continues to make a major contribution to the well-being of the Historical Society that he helped to create and worked so diligently and enthusiastically to make an outstanding organization. Three Scholarship Awards

Again this year the Society gave three \$1,000 scholarships - two from the Society and the third from the Eleanor Purney Scholarship, donated by the Galpin and McFadden families.

Lisa Martin, the Purney Scholarship awardee, is a second-year nursing student at the University of Maine in Augusta, while working as a medication technician/CNA at Cove's Edge. Lisa plans to stay in the area and continue to help others with her work in the medical field.

Christina Powell was awarded a Society scholarship for the second year, as she enters her junior year at the University of Maine in Orono to study Psychology and International Affairs.

Addison de Lisle, a Lincoln Academy graduate, will major in human ecology studies as a freshman at the College of the Atlantic. Human ecology is the study of the human interaction with the environment.

The Society's Scholarship Committee and the Town's Dow Memorial Scholarship Committee used a common application form and considered the same group of students.

Oral History Project with Nobleboro School

Bob Dunbar initiated an Oral History Project with the Nobleboro School this summer - and while still in the planning process, Daryl Hahn, the 8th history teacher expects the project to happen next spring. The Society is supporting Jo Radner, an experienced oral history person, to come and work with Daryl and help develop and implement the project. We are exploring a community event to share the experience and the fun. With Bob's help the Society will consider publishing the results of the project.

We will need 6-8 volunteers to work with the students for a few weeks - they will focus on the Depression and war years? It will be fun!

Nobleboro Cemeteries

Several Society members, Jean & Dick Vose, Tom Moody, and I, are working with the Town Cemetery Committee to do an inventory of the condition of the 84 cemeteries, especially the veterans' graves, as requested by the Selectmen.

Jean has generously offered to enter the information about the Town cemeteries into a special computer program. The information will eventually be available on our website for genealogies - and then organized into the Nobleboro Cemetery Book that George requested that the Society research and publish.

Historical Center Care

Once again, thanks to Norm & Peggy Van Dine who planted and tended the attractive garden in front of the Center ~ it looks great!

Our new Building Chair was busy and stained the front steps, along with several other tasks.

Bill Horton figured out how to disassemble the door to the old stove and replace the mica sheets. Good work as always!

This winter Brian Lawrence, who made the Center's new doors last year, will repair 1-2 of our old windows to secure our collection and stop the windows' deterioration, thanks to the Town which owns the Center. Also, the vinyl siding at the peak of the roof that fell off early this spring will be replaced.

Resource Committee

Sylvia Keene and Joan Gregoire, co-chairs, Roger Hathaway, and I are reorganizing the vault and office to incorporate the three file cabinets, copier, tables, and many other things from George's home.

We are also going to computerize our artifacts list and improve the preservation, access, and display of our wonderful collection. We are off to a great start - and are learning a lot as we go along.
