Nobleboro Historical Center	<b>7:00 P.M.</b> <b>David Andrews</b> will describe the resettlement of the long abandoned Bristol and Boothbay peninsular after a newly appointed Survey of the King's Woods in 1729. Former Colonel David Dunbar brought Scotch-Irish settlers hoping to create the new colony of Georgia. His scheme soon failed in no small part due to his pugnacious character. However, the influence of his actions echo through the history of the region and can still be seen in the towns and people of the Bristol peninsular today.
